

Homecoming Dress Guidelines 2022

Homecoming is a time to show your spirit. For this week we have made adjustments to the dress down guidelines. Please follow the guidelines set forth below so that everyone can enjoy the week.

General guidelines for the week:

Monday Theme Day: 6 – Mexico (green, white & red), 7 – Canada (red & white), 8 – USA (red, white & blue), 9 – Spain (red, yellow & red), 10 – France (blue, white & red), 11 – Brazil (green, yellow & blue), 12 – Argentina (blue, white & blue)

Tuesday Choose a Channel!: Students dress in as recognizable characters or themes from one of the approved TV channels: Cartoon Channel, Food Network, ESPN, Nickelodeon, Disney, History, Animal Planet, SciFi.

Guidelines for Monday and Tuesday: Theme Days - Clothing must be of appropriate and modest fit, and no undergarments may be visible. All clothing must have modest coverage – midribs and torsos should be covered; clothing should not be revealing. Tobacco, alcohol, drug and violent references in both props and clothing are prohibited. Props that are distracting or weapons (even if toys) are prohibited. Flip flops may be worn.

May Be Worn

- Athletic pants and sweat pants may be worn.
- Sleeveless tops and tank tops with straps at least two inches wide are permitted.
- Shorts or skirts, if worn, must meet the fingertips of the students when their shoulders are relaxed. Athletic shorts that meet the guidelines are acceptable.
- Shorts or skirts shorter than fingertips of the students when shoulders are relaxed must have leggings or tights under them.
- Hats may be worn.
- Face-paint, as long as 50% of the face is visible, is permitted.

May Not Be Worn

- Leggings may not be worn without a skirt or shorts over them.
- Spaghetti straps may not be worn.
- Lounge pants, yoga pants, and pajama pants may not be worn.

Wednesday: Homecoming t-shirts from any year are acceptable. Uniform polo shirts or PE shirts are acceptable. Shorts, if worn, must meet the fingertips of the students when their shoulders are relaxed. Athletic shorts that meet the guidelines are acceptable. Jeans may be worn. Leggings may **not** be worn. Flip flops and athletic slides may **not** be worn. **NO SKIRTS!**

Thursday: Mass Day – Either students' tops/shirts or pants must be primarily and recognizably the class color (12 – Green and White, 11 – Black, 10 – Yellow, 9 – Blue, 8 – Red, 7 – Purple, 6 – Orange). **Shorts, skirts, and dresses may NOT be worn.** Pants must be dress pants (may be black, khaki, navy, gray or the assigned class color). **Colored jeans** are not dress pants. Flip flops may not be worn. Athletic shoes may be worn.

Friday: Spirit Day – Clothing should show school spirit – green and white or any CCHS apparel. Please follow the Monday and Tuesday guidelines.

Teachers have the right to ask a student to remove or put away pieces of a costume that are causing a distraction.
