ACADEMIC UPDATES

SECOND QUARTER PROGRESS REPORTS – Progress report grades for the second quarter closed last week, on Tuesday, November 22. Updated progress reports will be emailed from RenWeb on Sunday, December 4. Please review these reports for specific information about grades. Are assignments being submitted (0 out of "points possible" is a big clue)? Are assignments being turned in on time (look for half the "points possible")? How are your children doing on quizzes and tests? Exams are scheduled for the week of December 12 (schedule included below). The first semester closes on Friday, January 13, 2023, two weeks after we return from Christmas break. Upon our return in January, teachers will cover additional coursework and give tests (which will be calculated in second quarter grades) which will affect the first semester average. At this point, time remains for students to improve their grades if they are not where they want to be (or should be) academically.

FIRST SEMESTER EXAM SCHEDULE – Exams are almost upon us! All classes have exams, and exams must be taken at the scheduled times. Students should prepare for exams by reviewing past tests and quizzes, using study guides, rereading notes and homework/class assignments, reworking math problems, and so on. Teachers will be providing guidance on how to prepare next week. Please note that students will have two weeks of classes upon their return to school after Christmas break before the end of the semester. During those weeks, teachers will cover new material and make graded assignments.

If we have a two-hour delay due to weather during exam week, we will start that day's exams at 10 a.m. and school will be dismissed at 1:15 p.m. If school is cancelled on any exam day due to weather, exams for that day will take place on the next day the school is open. IN THE EVENT OF ANY WEATHER-RELATED CHANGES, CHECK THE SCHOOL WEBSITE, WATCH FOR A PARENT ALERT TEXT, OR FOLLOW THE SCHOOL'S TWITTER FEED FOR UP-TO-THE-MINUTE INFORMATION. First semester report cards will be mailed no later than Monday, January 23, 2023.

Re-enrollment forms will be sent home in early February to reserve your child's space in the class for next year. Registration forms for course requests for returning students will be distributed to students later in the spring. In preparation for next year, students should be focused on doing their best in their current classes since grades and work ethic are important factors in course placement.

Applications for all grade levels will be available online (www.charlestoncatholic-crw.org) by mid to late January 2023. Applications will be completed and submitted online. Admissions Testing

All students applying to CCHS will take an admissions test prior to their application being reviewed. Any rising 6th grader from Sacred Heart Grade School will take their admissions test at SHGS during the school day. All other students and families will coordinate admissions testing with Nancy McLaughlin.

NOTE – It is rare for CCHS to accept students as juniors and seniors. Only juniors and seniors moving into the area will be considered.

MIDDLE SCHOOL UPDATES

MIDDLE SCHOOL EXAMS – All Charleston Catholic students take semester exams. However, they serve an instructional purpose for our middle school students, helping them learn how to study for and take exams so they are better prepared for high school. For this reason, middle school exams make up only a small percentage of the overall grade. In fact, sixth grade exams are included in the second quarter grade and do not count as a separate calculation in semester grades. Quarter grades provide a more accurate assessment of your child's progress. Help your children prepare for exams by encouraging them to study over a period of time rather than cramming the night before the test. Also, to assist your children in doing their best, please make sure they have adequate rest and a good breakfast before coming to school each day.

WEST VIRGINIA HISTORY BOWL—In 2010, the West Virginia Department of Arts, Culture and History began an exciting new challenge for eighth graders to test their West Virginia history: the West Virginia History Bowl Tournament. Teams of students from around the state face off in an academic bowl competition focusing on West Virginia history, literature, arts, architecture, geography and culture. Eighth graders in public, private and homeschool education programs are eligible to compete on the four-person teams in double-elimination tournament play. The regional tournament winners and the runner-up team move forward to the state tournament held in late April at the Culture Center at the State Capitol Complex. FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE

MORNING TARDIES—The school day starts each morning promptly at 8 am with prayer, pledge and morning announcement. Students are expected to be in class at that time. As stated in the Student Handbook (p. 13), students who are late to first period are required to serve a lunch detention that day. PARENT PHONE CALLS DO NOT EXCUSE THE TARDY. Students who come in late from a doctor's appointment must have an excuse from the doctor's office verifying the appointment in order to be excused from the lunch detention.

FREE MATH TUTORING-- As a service to Charleston Catholic students, our school's chapter of Mu Alpha Theta provides free math tutoring. This year, the tutoring service will take place in the Library on Tuesdays from 3:00 - 4:00 p.m. Just drop in, no appointments necessary! <u>VIRTUS</u> – Be sure you're able to help! All parents or other adults who volunteer, coach, drive students, chaperone, etc., are required by the Diocese to complete the diocesan sexual abuse awareness training before being allowed to work with our

students. Training is available online or at sessions periodically scheduled. To begin, visit the VirtusOnline.org and choose the online option. Allow 1- $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours to complete the program.

There will be a new process for the remaining two components of compliance. They will be completed using digital forms through the Virtus system (virtus.org). A background check and sign off on the Form Policy Relating to Sexual Abuse of Children MUST be completed online before you are able to volunteer. You must add Charleston Catholic as a location where you will be volunteering. If you have forgotten your password, or your user name, you can also call the Virtus help desk at 1-888-847-8870.

Additionally, adults who volunteer, coach, or chaperone, may be asked to update background and policy forms. Background checks must be updated every three years. Policy questionnaires should be updated if they were signed before 2014. Current Diocese guidelines do not require volunteers to update the training portion of VIRTUS. Please contact Mr. Villers with any questions about how to update your forms.

ACADEMIC ADVISING NOTES

- 1.) **SAT and ACT** testing and registration information is available online at --www.collegeboard.org and www.act.org (CCHS code: 490-205). All juniors should take each test at least once this year. Students will be taking the SAT school day at CCHS on Wednesday, March 22nd. There are many ways for students to practice and prepare for the SAT and the ACT
- Students can link their PSAT results to Khan Academy to create free customizable lessons to focus on targeted areas based on the student's PSAT scores.
- CCHS will be offering a SAT prep class that will start at the end of January and lead up to the SAT school day. The class will be held on Sunday nights and offered by CCHS faculty Sarah Griffith and Kate Shirley. The class will cost \$300. Registration details will be emailed to parents in early January.
- 2.) **College Visits-** Mrs. McLaughlin handles college visit requests. Students should pick up the forms from her or the office and return the completed forms to her at least 2 days before the trip. Seniors are allowed 2 college visit days; juniors are allowed 2 college visit days. All college visits must be made before May 1.
- 3.) The PROMISE Scholarship Application (www.cfwv.com/promise) and 2023-2024 FAFSA (www.fafsa.gov) are now available; both are due by March 1, 2023. Seniors must apply by the March 1 deadline, even if they do not currently meet the test score or GPA requirements. The PROMISE application and tutorial link are available at cfwv.com/promise. - 4.) **Eighth Grade Parent Meeting** -- Mark your calendars for Wednesday, February 15th. In order to be in compliance with this requirement, all CCHS cafeteria volunteers must complete a 75 minute online training course and 30 question assessment with a score of 70%. The PVA will pay the registration cost and will provide volunteers with an access code to participate in the course. - **4.) Parent involvement** is necessary for the successful operation of the CCHS athletic program. Helping drive students to games and practices, working gates, working concession stands, being supportive of the players and coaches, and attending games are just a few ways that parents help. EVERY parent of an athlete is needed to support the teams!
- 5.) Athletic family passes are available through the PVA. These passes are good for immediate family members only (not cousins, in-laws, ex-in-laws, grandparents, fiancées, etc.) to attend CCHS home games. The passes do not cover away games, tournaments played at home, homecoming games, or any SSAC tournaments. Cost is \$175 for all home middle school games only, \$200 for all home high school games only, and \$250 for all home games (both levels). A \$100 student or senior citizen pass for all home games is also available. Passes may be purchased during registration days at the PVA table. 
HANDBOOOK REMINDERS

<u>MEDICATION-</u>Any student taking medication, prescription or over-the-counter, during school hours must report this to the school office. Students taking medication during school hours must have a Diocesan form on file in the school office. Medication is to be given to the office staff who will dispense it at times designated on the permission slip. All medications in the office will be returned to students at the end of the year. Medications are not kept from year to year.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES—In order to participate in extracurricular activities on a particular day, a student must be in school for the FULL DAY on the day of the event. This "full day" policy includes appointments, so students need to avoid scheduling appointments during the school day. Students who have long-standing medical appointments, family funerals, or similar instances may be excused at the discretion of the Assistant Principal for Operations. Additionally, students must be at school for the majority of the school day in order to be eligible for practice. Students are also expected to be on time on days following athletic events. If a student is suspended at school, that student is also suspended from athletic practices, games, etc. for the FULL DAY on the day(s) suspended (i.e., if a student is suspended for a Tuesday, the suspension includes involvement in any school activities — sports, social, etc. — for Tuesday evening also).
