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ACADEMIC UPDATES

SECOND QUARTER PROGRESS REPORTS – Progress report grades for the second quarter closed before Thanksgiving on Tuesday, November 21. Updated progress reports will be emailed from RenWeb on Sunday, December 3. Please review these reports for specific information about grades. Are assignments being submitted (0 out of "points possible" is a big clue)? Are assignments being turned in on time (look for half the "points possible")? How are your children doing on quizzes and tests? Exams are scheduled for the week of December 11 (schedule included below). The first semester closes

on Friday, January 12, 2024, two weeks after we return from Christmas break. Upon our return in January, teachers will cover additional coursework and give tests (which will be calculated in second quarter grades) which will affect the first semester average. At this point, time remains for students to improve their grades if they are not where they want to be (or should be) academically.

<u>FIRST SEMESTER EXAM SCHEDULE</u> – Exams are right around the corner. <u>All classes have exams, and exams must be taken at the scheduled times</u>. Students should prepare for exams by reviewing past tests and quizzes, using study guides, rereading notes and homework/class assignments, reworking math problems, and so on. Teachers will be providing guidance on how to prepare next week.

If we have a two-hour delay due to weather during exam week, we will start that day's exams at 10 a.m. and school will be dismissed at 1:15 p.m. If school is cancelled on any exam day due to weather, exams for that day will take place on the next day the school is open. Fifth Grade Visit Day

Any fifth grade student is invited to attend our fifth grade visit day. It will be held on Thursday, February 8th, from 9 a.m. to noon. Fifth grade students will meet the current sixth grade teachers, take a tour of the school building, eat lunch in the Commons, and participate in their very first CCHS 'pep rally.' Families who do not attend Sacred Heart Grade School or St. Francis School should call the school office to register.

Admissions Testing

All students applying to CCHS will take an admissions test prior to their application being reviewed. Any rising 6th grader from Sacred Heart Grade School will take their admissions test at SHGS during the school day. All other students and families will coordinate admissions testing with Nancy McLaughlin.

NOTE – It is rare for CCHS to accept students as juniors and seniors. Only juniors and seniors moving into the area will be considered.

MIDDLE SCHOOL UPDATES

MIDDLE SCHOOL EXAMS – All Charleston Catholic students take semester exams. However, they serve an instructional purpose for our middle school students, helping them learn how to study for and take exams so they are better prepared for high school. For this reason, middle school exams make up only a small percentage of the overall grade. In fact, sixth grade exams are included in the second quarter grade and do not count as a separate calculation in semester grades. Quarter grades provide a more accurate assessment of your child's progress. Help your children prepare for exams by encouraging them to

study over a period of time rather than cramming the night before the test. Also, to assist your children in doing their best, please make sure they have adequate rest and a good breakfast before coming to school each day.

WEST VIRGINIA HISTORY BOWL-- In 2010, the West Virginia Department of Arts, Culture and History began an exciting new challenge for eighth graders to test their West Virginia history: the West Virginia History Bowl Tournament. Teams of students from around the state face off in an academic bowl competition focusing on West Virginia history, literature, arts, architecture, geography and culture. Eighth graders in public, private and home school education programs are eligible to compete on the four-person teams in double-elimination tournament play. The regional tournament winners and the runner-up team move forward to the state tournament held in late April at the Culture Center at the State Capitol Complex. FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE

MORNING TARDIES—The school day starts each morning promptly at 8 am with prayer, pledge and morning announcement. Students are expected to be in class at that time. As stated in the Student Handbook (p. 13), students who are late to first period are required to serve a lunch detention that day. PARENT PHONE CALLS DO NOT EXCUSE THE TARDY. Students who come in late from a doctor's appointment must have an excuse from the doctor's office verifying the appointment in order to be excused from the lunch detention.

<u>VIRTUS</u> – Be sure you're able to help! All parents or other adults who volunteer, coach, drive students, chaperone, etc., are required by the Diocese to complete the diocesan sexual abuse awareness training before being allowed to work with our students. Training is available online or at sessions periodically scheduled. To begin, visit the VirtusOnline.org and choose the "First Time Registrant" option. Allow 1- 1½ hours to complete the program.

The remaining two components of compliance will be completed using digital forms through the Virtus system (virtus.org). A background check and sign off on the Form Policy Relating to Sexual Abuse of Children MUST be

completed online before you are able to volunteer. You must add Charleston Catholic as a location where you will be volunteering.

Additionally, adults who volunteer, coach, or chaperone, may be asked to update background and policy forms. Background checks must be updated every three years. Policy questionnaires should be updated if they were signed before 2014. Current Diocese guidelines do not require volunteers to update the training portion of VIRTUS. Please contact Mr. Villers with any questions about how to update your forms.

- 1.) **SAT and ACT** testing and registration information is available online at --www.collegeboard.org and www.act.org (CCHS code: 490-205). All juniors should take each test at least once this year. Students will be taking the SAT School Day at CCHS on Tuesday, April 16th. There are many ways for students to practice and prepare for the SAT and the ACT
 - · Students can link their PSAT results to Khan Academy to create free customizable lessons to focus on targeted areas based on the student's PSAT scores.
 - · CCHS will be offering a SAT prep class that will start at the end of January and lead up to the SAT School Day. The class will be held on Sunday nights and offered by CCHS faculty Sarah Griffith and Kate Shirley. The class will cost \$300. Registration details will be emailed to parents in early January.


- The official use of the school logo and name are not permitted to be used on any personal online sources-blogs, websites, private groups, etc. without the written permission of the principal.
- Before publishing pictures of students online, please consider parental wishes.
- Publishing disparaging and/or defamatory comments about the school or anyone in the school community is not permitted.
- Engagement in online activities, such as, but not limited to, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc. may result in disciplinary actions if the content of student or parent's accounts includes defamatory comments regarding the school, the faculty, or other students.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES-- In order to participate in extracurricular activities on a particular day, a student must be in school for the FULL DAY on the day of the event. This "full day" policy includes appointments, so students need to avoid scheduling appointments during the school day. Students who have long-standing medical appointments, family funerals, or similar instances may be excused at the discretion of the Assistant Principal for Operations. Additionally, students must be at school for the majority of the school day in order to be eligible for practice. Students are also expected to be on time on days following athletic events. If a student is suspended at school, that student is also suspended from athletic practices, games, etc. for the FULL DAY on the day(s) suspended (i.e., if a student is suspended for a Tuesday, the suspension includes involvement in any school activities -- sports, social, etc. -- for Tuesday evening also).

 - 3) If no announcements are made for CCHS/SHGS, classes will be held on the regular schedule.
- 4) If a two-hour delay is announced, classes will start promptly at 10 a.m. The building will not open until 9:45 to give staff time to get to school. Please do not drop off your children before 9:45!
 - 5) As always, if you cannot get your child to school for health or safety reasons, notify the school.
